

TRANSPORTATION FROM E. 49TH STREET

The Village bus will pick up children on East 49th Street at 12:30 p.m. (M-F). Please call the Village Hall by 3:00 p.m. the day before to let us know if your child will need a ride to the pool.

The pool will close promptly at 5:00 p.m. for adult swim. All children must leave the pool area during this hour. Parents of children from East 49th Street must pick their children up promptly at 5:00 p.m.

In the case of inclement weather, the children will be moved from the playground area to the Contipelli Civic Center located in the Village Hall. When the weather clears up, the children will once again return to the pool and playground areas.

In rare instances of extreme weather, parents may be called to pick up their child immediately. If this should happen, children need to be picked up within 30 minutes of when they are called.

Just a reminder, the pool staff is not responsible to make sure your child stays in the pool area.


