Celebrations & Gatherings

We might be small, but our little village has a very long history of community gatherings and celebrations—the type of activities that knit together friends, relatives and neighbors into this place called home. As has been noted elsewhere in the book, many of these events have been going on for decades and are embedded as local traditions in the memory of our older citizens. These initial events have a new spin such as the Easter Bunny visiting the egg hunt each year. In the 1970s, Mrs. Claus joined Santa, and now a few high school volunteers, fulfilling community service hours as elves. As Cuyahoga Heights moves on, new events have been planned resulting from the creativity of dedicated committees. These celebrations have grown into annual traditions in their own rite. It is with pride that we present our scrapbook of these gatherings and celebrations from Cuyahoga Heights' history.

A Parade for History

The highly anticipated **Cuyahoga Heights 100th Anniversary Celebration** was held on August 10 and August 11, 2018. All festivities on Friday were at Klima Gardens while Saturday's events were kicked off with a splendid parade after which activities straddled Bacci Park (for the kids) and music, food, dancing and beverages could be found all day at our Klima Gardens venue.

Residents, present and former, lined East 71st Street to watch as Senior Citizens and members of the Historical Committee kicked off the parade. The Historical Committee was transporting the Time Capsule to Kennedy House for eventual opening and cataloguing all contents. Grand Marshal, Miss Delia Trevisani, our most senior lifelong resident, was accompanied by her nephews children: David Amari's sons, Bradley, Jonathan and grandson Owynn as well as Douglas' daughters, Kaitlyn and Madeline. All rode in a lovely white horse drawn carriage.

The Cleveland Mounted Police Unit Officers pranced along followed by Brooklyn Heights VFW Post 3483 carrying our beloved colors. Chief Sturgill and Deputy Chief Davis showed off our police cruiser leading Mayor Bacci's tractor and bubble-blowing hay wagon full of over 20 Bacci family members. Dear friend and former Parma Mayor Dean DePiero joined the family showering the crowd with candy.

John Bacci drove Councilmembers Rick Centa and Matt Schoeffler in former Mayor Lou Bacci's Lincoln Continental. Assistant Building Commissioner Ken LaBella drove elected officials Barb Biro, Renato Contipelli and Cheryl Harris in Jimmy Palladino's 1960 Pontiac Catalina convertible. Former Mayor Contipelli and former Council member Frank Schoeffler rode along in a golf cart (but left their clubs at home). Renee Duszynski, in a jaunty little convertible chauffeured her mom, former long-time member of Council, Marilyn LaBella Duszynski and Garfield Heights Municipal Court Judge Deborah Nicastro.

Next came Service Director Dave Sammons, Fire Chief Suhy—our squad, pumper and the aerial unit followed by the Cuyahoga Heights Police Department bicycle units. Residents Jim Fonte and Debbie Namy

showed off their bright yellow replica 1932 Coupe golf cart followed by Mary Rakauskas and Tony Anfuso in a Mercedes style golf cart. Clarence Knapik and wife, Barbara showed of his souped up historical 1949 Ford.

Law Director Ben Chojnacki was revving up former Law Director Jon Greenberg's Mustang convertible. Along came retired Village Clerk, Norbert Chase and his family in military vehicles. Ohio State Highway Patrol delivered Attorney General Mike and Frances Dewine, flanked by a team of supporters. Mike was campaigning to become Ohio's next Governor. Mayors Mike Procuk (Brooklyn Heights), Jerry Piasecki (Valley View), Anthony Togliatti (Independence), Richard Dell'Aquila (Seven Hills) joined in the parade. Brecksville's Mayor Jerry Hruby was the engineer of a really cool Safety Town train packed with neighborhood kids.

Boy Scouts Troop #28 created a float with a tent and all the trimmings. They were followed by Peter Corrigan, a candidate for County Executive. The staff of our local newspaper, *The Neighborhood News*, joined in as the most elegant Stix Stilt Walker in her colorful diaphanous costume literally floated up East 71st Street. School Superintendent Tom Evans and School Board members Gary Suchocki, Mark Dobbins, Joe Nejman and Maria Eder were next in line enjoying being transported in the Euclid Beach Rocket Ride. Our cheerleaders flanked the rocket while a red wave of Cuyahoga Heights School majorettes, our flag team members, the marching band including the Alumni band, football and soccer teams swarmed the area.

Batman made an appearance including his bat mobile! Slider, the Cleveland Indians' mascot, caused a stir as did Chomps, the Cleveland Browns' mascot. Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District and Metroparks representatives made their presence known, as did Ohio Bulk Transfer, Newburgh Heights police, an armored Lenco BearCat tactical vehicle and other fire vehicles. The parade lasted over forty minutes—probably a record for our village.



In 1993, a time capsule was buried under a rock that Louis “Gigi” Bacci had once placed in his yard to keep drivers from going into his lawn—well, many folks hit the rock or drove over it damaging vehicles and the lawn. After his death, wife Katherine, decided to get rid of the obstacle and had it pushed over the hill behind her home. Resident, Frank Domzalski, felt differently about Gigi’s rock and made the effort to not only retrieve the rock, but also find it a new home. It became the monument that covered the buried time capsule and was inscribed as this:

**Cuyahoga Heights Citizen’s Committee Time Capsule, sealed July 3, 1993,
in memory of Louis “Gigi” Bacci, son of Mayor and Lillian Bacci**

So, 25 years later, in 2018, the village’s 100th anniversary year, the time capsule was retrieved, opened, audited and its contents catalogued and every personal letter was given to the recipient, or if he/she were deceased, a descendant of that family.
