A RESOLUTION OPTING OUT OF THE NORTHEAST OHIO PUBLIC ENERGY COUNCIL (NOPEC) GREEN COMMUNITY CHOICE PROGRAM

Mr. Contipelli moved, seconded by Ms. Henley that the rules be suspended and the Resolution be placed on third and final reading.

Mr. Contipelli asks for a quick description of what this about. Mr Chojnacki briefly explained to the audience that in 2021, council passed a resolution opting to participate in the green community choice program. Upon learning more details about the program, it became apparent the program was designed for everyone in the community to be automatically opted in, which would hav resulted in the the community receiving an their energy bills increased by approximately \$3.55 per

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month to support green energy choices. That was not the intent behind the 2021 legislation, and the Village did not want to push this cost onto the residents. Therefore, so there could be no doubt as to the Village's intent, this legislation makes it clear that the Village does not want to "opt in" to that program. By repealing this legislation, there can be no doubt that the Village and NOPEC will continue to operate as they had in years past. Residents interested in green energy choice programs remain eligible to voluntarily opt-in to green programs, if they are interested.
