Shred Day

Saturday, July 12 is our annual shred day. Residents can bring their personal items to shred at Gateway Products Recycling located at 4223 East 49th Street from 9:00-11:00 a.m. For your convenience, we will have several service department employees on site to assist you with your paper bags and/or cardboard boxes of shredding material.

Kelleys Island

My annual trip to Kelleys Island with our village resident senior citizens (55 years of age and older) takes place on Monday, August 25. If you're not a member of our senior citizens' organization and haven't signed up for the trip at their monthly meeting, you can contact Lee Ann at the village hall during normal business hours for further information. The deadline to register is Tuesday, July 15.



Flu Shots

In cooperation with Independence Discount Drug Mart, Nurse Socausky and our office, flu shots and blood work will be offered to our village senior residents (60 years of age and older) on Friday, September 12 at Klima Gardens. So that we can safely manage the event, blood work appointments will begin at 8:30 a.m. in 10-minute increments; flu shots will begin at 9:00 a.m. in 3-minute increments. As a reminder, if you plan on getting blood work, please do not eat or drink anything except water, after midnight the night before. Flu shots and blood work will strictly be by appointment only. The deadline to register is Thursday, August 28. Please contact Lee Ann at the village hall during normal business hours to make an appointment. Drug Mart will provide us with registration forms which we will drop off at your home prior to your appointment. You will need to fill it out and bring it with you on the day of your appointment. We will again be serving a warm breakfast for our seniors, packaged in individual containers, so you can either eat at Klima's or take it home with you. If you are 65 years of age or older, please bring your Medicare Card as we will seek Medicare payment for qualifying seniors. Our village will pay for flu shots for our village senior residents and employees just like we've done in the past.


Birthdays


A MESSAGE FROM POLICE CHIEF, BRIAN STURGILL

Dear Residents and Valued Business Partners:

It seems that we have finally reached the beginning of the summer season. With the warmer weather and longer days comes an increase in pedestrian and bicycle traffic (especially children) on the sidewalks and streets. We ask that you please pay increased attention and be more cautious while entering and exiting of driveways and while driving through our residential areas.

While on the subject of bicycling...

We all can agree that while riding a bicycle is fun, healthy, and a great way to be independent, it unfortunately does not come without dangers. As summer approaches, CHPD officers will begin to engage with our community in order to pass along recognized safety tips and village regulations concerning the ever-popular activity.





In 2020, <u>Village Codified Ordinance #444.07- SAFE RIDING REGULATIONS for BICYCLES</u> was amended to require all bicycle (and scooter) operators under the age of 16-years to wear a helmet.

444.07 - SAFE RIDING REGULATIONS FOR BICYCLES

(i) All persons under the age of sixteen (16) years old shall wear a helmet at all times they are operating a bicycle within the Village.

Although the ordinance only requires helmets for those under 16 years of age, it is highly recommended that all riders (no matter the age) wear a protective helmet while riding. Please share and discuss this important information with all young people under your care.

Additionally, there has been a noticeable increase in the popularity (and use) of **"E-Scooters"** and **"E-Bicycles"** in the village. In 2020 the village council passed an ordinance pertaining to these types of vehicles.

Attached you will find **Cuyahoga Heights Codified Ordinance #451.01** which explains the rules governing electric and gas-powered vehicles.

Some important rules to note:

- Helmets are required of all riders under the age of 16 years of age.
- E-Scooters that are capable of over 15 mph are prohibited for all.
- All bicycles, e-scooters and e-bicycles require lights to be operated after dark.
- All motorized boards are prohibited. This includes "one-wheels" and "hover boards".



A MESSAGE FROM POLICE CHIEF, BRIAN STURGILL

451.01 OPERATION OF CERTAIN MOTORIZED VEHICLES IN THE VILLAGE.

(a) The vehicles described below shall only be operated in accordance with the restrictions established below:

Motor Vehicle Type	Location	Helmet Required
Vehicles licensed by the State	Permitted on all public roads	None
Golf carts	Refer to Chapter 450 of the Codified Ordinances	Refer to <u>Chapter 450</u> of the Codified Ordinances
Electric or gas powered scooters not capable of traveling faster than 15 miles per hour	If operator is 16 years old or older, permitted on all public roads, provided that the operator complies with all safety laws and stays within 3 feet from the curb or the edge of the pavement. If operator is younger than 16 years old, permitted on the following streets: Dressler Ct., Bletch Ct., E. 72nd Pl., Marcelline Ct., Willowbrook Dr. Operation on sidewalks adjacent to Canal Rd., E. 71st St., E. 49th St., Grant Ave.	Required if operator is younger than 16 years old.
Electric or gas scooters capable of traveling in excess of 15 miles per hour or greater	Prohibited.	NA
Electric-powered bicycles	May be operated on public roads in a manner consistent with <u>Chapter 444</u> of the Codified Ordinances. Class 1 and Class 2 electric powered bicycles are permitted on park trails. Class 3 bicycles are not permitted on park trails.	Must be worn in compliance with Chapter 444 of the Codified Ordinances.
Gas-powered bicycles	Prohibited, except as otherwise permitted under <u>Chapter 444</u> of the Codified Ordinances.	Where not prohibited, must be worn in compliance with <u>Chapter</u> 444 of the Codified Ordinances.
Bicycles	May be operated on public roads, if operator stays within three feet of curb or edge of pavement. Operators under 16 years old may operate bicycles on Village sidewalks.	Required if operator is younger than 16 years old.
Motorized boards powered by gas or electricity	Prohibited.	NA
Mobility vehicles necessary to assist with a handicap, disability, or health condition	Permitted in any location.	Not required.



A MESSAGE FROM POLICE CHIEF, BRIAN STURGILL

- (1) "Class 1 electric bicycle" means a bicycle that is equipped with fully operable pedals and an electric motor of less than seven hundred fifty watts that provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling and ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of twenty miles per hour.
- (2) "Class 2 electric bicycle" means a bicycle that is equipped with fully operable pedals and an electric motor of less than seven hundred fifty watts that may provide assistance regardless of whether the rider is pedaling and is not capable of providing assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of twenty miles per hour.
- (3) "Class 3 electric bicycle" means a bicycle that is equipped with fully operable pedals and an electric motor of less than seven hundred fifty watts that provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling and ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of twenty-eight miles per hour.
- (b) In an effort to ensure safety and continuity between the Village's trails and the trails operated by the Cleveland Metroparks, nothing in this Chapter shall be enforced in a manner that is inconsistent with the laws, rules, and restrictions established by the Cleveland Metroparks for the operation of any of the foregoing vehicles on trails operated by the Cleveland Metroparks.


A Message From Your Fire Chief, Mike Suhy



FIREWORKS are often used to mark special events and holidays. The only safe way to view fireworks is to attend a professional show. It is important to know that **fireworks are not safe in the hands of consumers**. Fireworks cause thousands of injuries each year.

A few ideas to get into the patriotic spirit, without fireworks:

- Use glow sticks, they glow in the dark and are a safe alternative to a sparkler. Fun for all ages.
- Loud and proud. Noise makers are sure to make a statement. They can be found at local party supply stores or make your own.
- Outdoor movie night. Set up a screen and projector. Don't forget the bugspray!
- 4. Red, white and blue silly string...fun for all ages.
- Make a patriotic craft with the family.
- Throw a birthday party for the USA, and don't forget the cake.



FACTS

- More than 31,000 reported fires are started by fireworks annually.
- Burns account for 38% of the 7,400 injuries treated in emergency rooms in the month around July 4.
- ! Half of the fireworks injuries at emergency rooms were extremities: hand, finger, or leg. One-third were to the eye or other parts of the head.
- (1) Children younger than 15 years old accounted for 28% of the estimated fireworks injuries.
- Sparklers account for 29% of fireworks injuries for children under the age of 5 treated in emergency rooms in the month around July 4.



This summer you may be thinking about building a deck to enjoy the nice warmer weather. Before you begin your deck project, you will need to submit a few items to get a permit from the building department. Permits are required for the installation of any deck.

Deck Building Guidelines:

- Complete a building permit application, available on the village's website <u>www.cuyahogaheights.com</u>, through our GovPilot portal.
- Provide a site plan showing the location of the existing house and proposed location of the deck.
- Make sure you are aware of the property line setbacks.
- Submit two sets of drawings describing the material intended to be used and a cross section of the deck and a railing detail.

Basic quidelines to build a deck:

- All decks more than 30 inches above the grade must have a guardrail with a minimum height of 36 inches.
- The footer for deck post holes must be a minimum of 38 inches deep.
- Deck post must be a minimum of 4" x 4".
- Three building department inspections are required: Footer (postholes),
 Framing & Final Inspection

Spiral Stairways:

Spiral stairways are permitted, provided that the clear width at and below the handrail is not less than 26 inches and the walkline radius is not grater than 24-1/2 inches. Each tread shall have a depth of not less than 6-3/4 inches at the walkline. All treads shall be identical, and the rise shall not be more than 9-1/2 inches. Headroom shall be not less than 6 feet, 6 inches.



The George M. Suhy Grant Program

The process is now done online through our website at www.cuyahogaheights.com, click on the online services tab at the top of the page and scroll down to Suhy grant application. This is where you will start your application for your grant. Please follow the steps listed below:

If using a contractor, the contractor must be registered with the village's building department. Once they are registered, they will receive a contractor registration number.

You or your contractor must apply for a construction permit for your project, (the permit application also can be accessed through the online services tab on our website.) Once your application is reviewed and approved by the building department, you will be emailed an approval with the permit fee, there will be an attached link to pay for your permit fee online. Once the permit is paid for, you will receive a permit.

Complete the George M. Suhy grant application.

Schedule a pre-inspection of your project with the building department, (a pre-existing picture is required before new work can be started).

Proceed with your project, if your project needs an outsourced inspection, the building department will notify you.

Complete your project.

Schedule a final inspection with the building department (a picture of completed work will be required).

Submit all receipts and have your contractor sign and date their invoice, the contractor must verify how the invoice was paid. If the contactor's invoice was paid by a check, the building department will need a copy of the deposited check front and back, if the invoice was paid by a credit card, we will need a statement showing paid with a confirmation number for the credit card used and if the invoice was paid by cash, your contractor will have to sign, date and write paid in full by cash.

Once all the above steps have been completed, you will receive your grant check by mail within 45

Please note: If you do not have access to a computer, please call the building department and we can schedule a time when you can come into the village hall, and we will assist you in filling the application out on a village computer. Please call 216-641-7020 to schedule with the building department Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. and 1:00-4:30 p.m.

Garbage Pick Up/ Recycling/ Yard Waste

Our service department collects garbage every Monday morning beginning at 8:00 a.m. at no charge to its residents. They will come into your yard and take your garbage tote and recycling container to the curb; afterwards they will carry it back into your yard. Please note that if a holiday falls on a Monday; the service will commence on Tuesday.

Newspaper/ Cardboard Recycling

Do your part in helping the environment; recycle cardboard and newspaper. Our village has a recycling container located at Bacci Park in the rear of the back parking lot. The container is strictly for cardboard and newspaper. Please make sure to break down your cardboard boxes before placing them in the container. Stop on down and do your part in recycling. If you have a large amount and are unable to take it to the container, please call the service department during normal business hours prior to Tuesday mornings; we will put it on our "special pick up" list.

Special Pick Up—NOW ONLINE!

If you need a special pick up for trash that is oversized, large amounts, or hazardous waste, you can now go online to be put on the special pick up list. Special pick up day is on Tuesday mornings, unless there is a holiday on Monday, at which time, the special pick up will be taken care of on Wednesday. You must submit your information by 4:00 p.m. on Monday to get on the list for Tuesday's pick up. Please visit www.cuyahogaheights.com at the top select 'Online Services' & select the red 'Special Pick Up' tab. Please fill out your name, address, and all information regarding items you would like to be picked up and where they are located. You will then get an email response when the request has been successfully submitted. If you have any questions, please contact Vera at 216-641-3505.

Charity Pick Up—NOW ONLINE!

Our service department will pick up any small usable item at your residence that you would like to donate to charity on the first Wednesday of each month. Small household items, clothes, etc., are collected and donated. No tax receipts are given for this service. Please visit www.cuyahogaheights.com at the top select 'Online Services' & select the red 'Charity Pick Up' tab. Please enter your address and select from the drop down. Fill out your name, phone number, email address and all information regarding items you would like to donate and where items are located. This must be submitted prior to the first Wednesday of the month for this service. You will then get an email response when the request has been successfully submitted. If you have any questions, please contact Vera at 216-641-3505.

Dumpster Rentals—NOW ONLINE!

Residents may rent a village dumpster for personal use at their home by paying \$30.00 to the village for each dumpster load. Dumpsters can be used for yard waste, construction debris or miscellaneous household items NOT including carpet, tires, or hazardous waste. Please do not mix materials. Please visit www.cuyahogaheights.com at the top select 'Online Services' & select the red 'Dumpster Rental' tab. Provide your information and select a preferred delivery date for the dumpster & specify the location for placement. You can now conveniently pay the fee online through a link that will be sent to your email. You also can drop off cash or check payments at village hall. Use of the dumpster is for a maximum of two (2) weeks. After two (2) weeks, the dumpster will be picked up from the resident's home. If the resident needs to use it again, he/she will go back on the waiting list. Please note that the disposal of debris created from outside the village is prohibited.

Table & Chair Rental—NOW ONLINE!

A limited number of tables and chairs are available for use by residents having parties at their residence, free of charge. To reserve your tables and chairs, simply head to the top of our village website homepage, click on 'Online Services', and then select 'Table & Chair Rental'. From there, you can fill out the application to secure your rental and schedule a pick-up time.

Pest and Insect Control Service—NOW ONLINE!

Pest control services can be easily accessed through our village website! Simply navigate to the top of the homepage, select 'Online Services', and then choose 'Pest & Insect Control'. From there, you can complete the application. Once we receive your request, the service department will coordinate with our pest control vendor. This service is complimentary, with the exception of termites, bed bugs, and wildlife. Additionally, the village conducts exterior spraying of your home in the spring to help prevent unwanted pests from entering. As always, you can also reach out to the service department to report any issues by calling 216-641-3505.

Grass Cutting—NOW ONLINE!

The village offers lawn mowing services for senior citizens aged 60 and older who qualify for the program at their homes. Before we can assist you, a signed waiver is necessary. You can find the forms online or submit them at the village hall. If you're uncertain about having a waiver on file, feel free to contact the service department. Additionally, please remember to regularly clean up any dog waste.

Garden Rototilling—NOW ONLINE!

The Cuyahoga Heights Service Department offers complimentary rotatilling of residential gardens once a year, upon request. Please make sure to clearly mark the area that needs rotatilling before the scheduled date. To set up your appointment, you can visit our website under 'Online Services' or contact the service department.

Tree Trimming/Removal Service—NOW ONLINE!

The village will provide a professional tree trimmer to remove or trim a tree on a resident's property. Please note that tree trimming/removal is limited to two (2) trims per year and one (1) removal. If a crane is needed for tree removal, it is the responsibility of the homeowner to pay for the service. In addition, if a stump needs ground, it is the responsibility of the homeowner to pay for this service, whether the homeowner uses the tree company that the village has a contract with or another tree company. Please visit online at www.cuyahogaheights.com under 'Online Services' & select the red 'Tree Trimming' tab.

Meals on Wheels (By Lori's Custom Catering)—NOW ONLINE!

Visit www.cuyahogaheights.com at the top select 'Online Services' & select the red 'Meals On Wheels' tab to fill out an application. This service is available to any village resident that is 60 years of age or older. A lunchtime meal will be delivered to your home daily, Monday through Friday, by our service department. This is an affordable option, the cost is \$25.00 per week, which is only \$5.00 per day (you must sign-up up for a full week.) To receive meals for a given week, payment must be made by the Thursday prior. 
