



#### From the office of your CFO, Angel Meriwether

As summer winds down and we head into fall, the Fiscal Office continues to keep a close watch on revenues, expenses, and planning for the year-end. September is an important month as we review our third-quarter financial position and begin preparing for next year's budget.

#### Where We Stand - Year-to-Date Snapshot

**Revenues**: Income tax collections are on track, with about 68% of our yearly estimate already received. This helps fund critical services like police, fire, road repairs, and parks.

**Expenses:** As of July 31, we've spent about 52% of the annual budget, ensuring resources are used efficiently.

#### **Investing in Our Community**

This fall, funding is at work in several important ways:

- Street resurfacing.
- Upgrades to parks and recreation facilities.

With the Mayor, Council, Fiscal Office, and residents working hand in hand, we're continuing a tradition of strength and stability for generations to come.
