At this time, I wanted to give everyone a brief update on several items and/or projects that are happening around town. Nicky Boulevard

I, along with our Law Director and Engineer, recently went to Columbus to meet with the Ohio EPA. They understand the undertaking of what we are doing at Nicky Boulevard and are assisting us to secure, and ultimately use brownfield monies, to strengthen this project as we move forward. I also want to note that there are so many partners assisting us over the years in so many ways with this project, and that it truly takes a team.

You may have noticed that work halted during the past few months at the former site of the Hillside property. It was due to complications with material that was buried beneath the surface. With the efforts from our team, we were able to get them back on track, and very soon they will continue to construct their building. We are very excited and look forward to having them in town. Senator Ferry Cirino

For those that were unaware, Senator Cirino visited our schools on Monday, September 15, which was a prime opportunity to showcase the uniqueness of our school district, as well as our district communities as a whole. Senator Cirino toured the classrooms and facilities while the administration highlighted why they believe CHS is a model public school district. In addition, I had the opportunity to speak with the Senator following his visit. Amongst all the positive comments he had about our district and village as a whole, he likened the experience in the hallways of CHS to that of a private school or institution. To that, we also discussed that small districts like ours **SHOULD NOT** be lumped in or considered for any cuts or budget restrictions which would ultimately impact the intimacy and quality of education that our students receive. We also conversed about the idea that is being discussed in Columbus on eliminating property tax and how this idea is borderline insanity. It will just force lawmakers to tax us in other ways that would be no longer funded through property tax. The elimination of property tax is truly an idea that is too good to be true.


CONGRATULATIONS

Halloween Safety

Walk Safely

- · Cross the street at corners, using traffic signals and crosswalks. Look left, right and left again when crossing and keep looking as you cross.
- · Put electronic devices down, keep heads up and walk, don't run, across the street.
- · Teach children to make eye contact with drivers before crossing in front of them.
- · Always walk on sidewalks. If there are no sidewalks, walk facing traffic as far to the left as possible. Children should walk on direct routes with the fewest street crossings.
- Watch for cars that are turning or backing up. Teach children to never dart out into the street or cross between parked cars.
- Join kids under age 12 for trick-or-treating. If kids are mature enough to be out without supervision, tell them to stick to familiar areas that are well lit and trick-or-treat in groups.

Costumes for a Safe Halloween


- Decorate costumes and bags with reflective tape or stickers and, if possible, choose light colors.
- Choose face paint and makeup whenever possible instead of masks, which can obstruct a child's vision.
- Have kids carry glow sticks or flashlights to help them see and be seen by drivers.
- When selecting a costume, make sure it is the right size to prevent trips and falls.

Drive Extra Safely on Halloween

- · Slow down and be especially alert in residential neighborhoods. Children are excited on Halloween and may move in unpredictable ways.
- · Take extra time to look for kids at intersections and on curbs.
- · Enter and exit driveways and alleys slowly and carefully.
- · Get rid of any distractions like your phone in your car so you can concentrate on the road and your surroundings.
- · Turn your headlights on earlier in the day to spot children from greater distances.
- · DRIVE SOBER!!!

Hope everyone has been enjoying the beautiful weather we have been having over the past five weeks! With the fall season approaching fast, we recommend completing some general exterior and interior property maintenance to keep your home safe and secure throughout the cooler season. Many of these recommendations are proactive, simple things you can check and correct before the temps start to drop.

FALL INTERIOR MAINTENANCE TIPS:

- · Change filters throughout your home such as in your furnace, air conditioner, stove vent, dryer and fans.
- Check faucets in the bathrooms, kitchens and laundry room for leaks and other repair needs. It is best to make
 faucet repairs now before winter, you may be able to avoid a more
 complicated repair if the pipe freezes and breaks.
- If you have a fireplace, examine it thoroughly. Ensure the damper is open to allow air to flow freely and check the handles and springs to make sure the flue is operating correctly. If used regularly, the chimney should be professionally inspected and cleaned.
- Drain and inspect the hot water tank for rust developing in the tank. If the tank is older and/or is rusting, it may be a good time to buy a newer more energy efficient and cost effective one.
- · Check windows and doors to ensure the seal and caulk are in good condition.
- Check all your smoke detectors, make sure they are all working properly. All bedrooms and every floor of your home should have a smoke detector.

FALL EXTERIOR MAINTENANCE TIPS:

- Check the roof, gutters and downspouts for any debris that may need to be removed. Check the flashings around your chimney and any other openings in the roof.
- Clean up your yard: trim bushes, shrubs and trees. Clean up leaf debris and your flower beds.
- Inspect your driveway, walkways and entryways. Fill or repair cracks before sealing.
- · Shut off and drain all faucets, hoses and lawn irrigation systems.
- Check all windows and doors to make sure they are properly sealed

DID YOU KNOW?

Smoke Alarms

Location – single and multi-station smoke alarms shall be installed:

O In each bedroom.

Outside each separate sleeping area in the immediate vicinity of the bedrooms.

On each story, including basements and habitable attics, but not including crawl spaces and uninhabitable attics.

O Not less than 3 feet horizontally from the door or opening of a bathroom with a bathtub or shower.

The George M. Suhy Grant Program

The process is now done online through our website at www.cuyahogaheights.com, click on the online services tab at the top of the page and scroll down to Suhy grant application. This is where you will start your application for your grant. Please follow the steps listed below:

If using a contractor, the contractor must be registered with the village's building department.
Once they are registered, they will receive a contractor registration number.

You or your contractor must apply for a construction permit for your project, (the permit application also can be accessed through the online services tab on our website.) Once your application is reviewed and approved by the building department, you will be emailed an approval with the permit fee, there will be an attached link to pay for your permit fee online. Once the permit is paid for, you will receive a permit.

Complete the George M. Suhy grant application.

Schedule a pre-inspection of your project with the building department, (a pre-existing picture is required before new work can be started).

Proceed with your project, if your project needs an outsourced inspection, the building department will notify you.

Complete your project.

Schedule a final inspection with the building department (a picture of completed work will be required).

Submit all receipts and have your contractor sign and date their invoice, the contractor must verify how the invoice was paid. If the contactor's invoice was paid by a check, the building department will need a copy of the deposited check front and back, if the invoice was paid by a credit card, we will need a statement showing paid with a confirmation number for the credit card used and if the invoice was paid by cash, your contractor will have to sign, date and write paid in full by cash.

Once all the above steps have been completed, you will receive your grant check by mail within 45 days.

Please note: If you do not have access to a computer, please call the building department and we can schedule a time when you can come into the village hall, and we will assist you in filling the application out on a village computer. Please call 216-641-7020 to schedule with the building department Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. and 1:00-4:30 p.m.

Garbage Pick Up/ Recycling/ Yard Waste

Our service department collects garbage every Monday morning beginning at 8:00 a.m. at no charge to its residents. They will come into your yard and take your garbage tote and recycling container to the curb; afterwards they will carry it back into your yard. Please note that if a holiday falls on a Monday; the service will commence on Tuesday.

Newspaper/ Cardboard Recycling

Do your part in helping the environment; recycle cardboard and newspaper. Our village has a recycling container located at Bacci Park in the rear of the back parking lot. The container is strictly for cardboard and newspaper. Please make sure to break down your cardboard boxes before placing them in the container. Stop on down and do your part in recycling. If you have a large amount and are unable to take it to the container, please call the service department during normal business hours prior to Tuesday mornings; we will put it on our "special pick up" list.

Special Pick Up—NOW ONLINE!

If you need a special pick up for trash that is oversized, large amounts, or hazardous waste, you can now go online to be put on the special pick up list. Special pick up day is on Tuesday mornings, unless there is a holiday on Monday, at which time, the special pick up will be taken care of on Wednesday. You must submit your information by 4:00 p.m. on Monday to get on the list for Tuesday's pick up. Please visit www.cuyahogaheights.com at the top select 'Online Services' & select the red 'Special Pick Up' tab. Please fill out your name, address, and all information regarding items you would like to be picked up and where they are located. You will then get an email response when the request has been successfully submitted. If you have any questions, please contact Vera at 216-641-3505.

Charity Pick Up—NOW ONLINE!

Our service department will pick up any small usable item at your residence that you would like to donate to charity on the first Wednesday of each month. Small household items, clothes, etc., are collected and donated. No tax receipts are given for this service. Please visit www.cuyahoqaheights.com at the top select 'Online Services' & select the red 'Charity Pick Up' tab. Please enter your address and select from the drop down. Fill out your name, phone number, email address and all information regarding items you would like to donate and where items are located. This must be submitted prior to the first Wednesday of the month for this service. You will then get an email response when the request has been successfully submitted. If you have any questions, please contact Vera at 216-641-3505.

Dumpster Rentals—NOW ONLINE!

Residents may rent a village dumpster for personal use at their home by paying \$30.00 to the village for each dumpster load. Dumpsters can be used for yard waste, construction debris or miscellaneous household items NOT including carpet, tires, or hazardous waste. Please do not mix materials. Please visit www.cuyahogaheights.com at the top select 'Online Services' & select the red 'Dumpster Rental' tab. Provide your information and select a preferred delivery date for the dumpster & specify the location for placement. You can now conveniently pay the fee online through a link that will be sent to your email. You also can drop off cash or check payments at village hall. Use of the dumpster is for a maximum of two (2) weeks. After two (2) weeks, the dumpster will be picked up from the resident's home. If the resident needs to use it again, he/she will go back on the waiting list. Please note that the disposal of debris created from outside the village is prohibited.

Table & Chair Rental—NOW ONLINE!

A limited number of tables and chairs are available for use by residents having parties at their residence, free of charge. To reserve your tables and chairs, simply head to the top of our village website homepage, click on 'Online Services', and then select 'Table & Chair Rental'. From there, you can fill out the application to secure your rental and schedule a pick-up time.

Pest and Insect Control Service—NOW ONLINE!

Pest control services can be easily accessed through our village website! Simply navigate to the top of the homepage, select 'Online Services', and then choose 'Pest & Insect Control'. From there, you can complete the application. Once we receive your request, the service department will coordinate with our pest control vendor. This service is complimentary, with the exception of termites, bed bugs, and wildlife. Additionally, the village conducts exterior spraying of your home in the spring to help prevent unwanted pests from entering. As always, you can also reach out to the service department to report any issues by calling 216-641-3505.

Tree Trimming/Removal Service—NOW ONLINE!

The village will provide a professional tree trimmer to remove or trim a tree on a resident's property. Please note that tree trimming/removal is limited to two (2) trims per year and one (1) removal. If a crane is needed for tree removal, it is the responsibility of the homeowner to pay for the service. In addition, if a stump needs ground, it is the responsibility of the homeowner to pay for this service, whether the homeowner uses the tree company that the village has a contract with or another tree company. Meals on Wheels (By Lori's Custom Catering)—NOW ONLINE!

Visit www.cuyahogaheights.com at the top select 'Online Services' & select the red 'Meals On Wheels' tab to fill out an application. This service is available to any village resident that is 60 years of age or older. A lunchtime meal will be delivered to your home daily, Monday through Friday, by our service department. This is an affordable option, the cost is \$25.00 per week, which is only \$5.00 per day (you must sign-up up for a full week.) To receive meals for a given week, payment must be made by the Thursday prior. 
