**COUNCIL MEETING** 

October 8, 2025

#### COUNCIL PRESIDENT CONTIPELLI CALLED CAUCUS TO ORDER at 5:01 p.m.

MAYOR BACCI CALLED ROLL CALL: Schoeffler, Unger, Volek, Bloam, Centa, Contipelli

Mr. Contipelli asked council if anyone had any questions on the agenda.

Mr. Schoeffler asked for clarification on the legislation of the two Marcelline homes regarding change orders and if the prevailing wages were not disclosed before the project started. CFO Meriwether responded that while yes, the prevailing wages were not included in the initial bid, there were also sewer issues and after the final plans review, fire stop walls needed to be installed. Mr. Contipelli asked the mayor to give an update on the Marcelline homes. Mayor Bacci advised that the easterly home will be finished around Thanksgiving, while the westerly home will have drywall up and the homeowner can design how they want it.

Mayor Bacci mentioned that since the pool has closed for the season, Parks & Rec Director Wheaton will be attending the monthly council meetings. However, she is on vacation this week but will be joining us next month. He further noted that Ms. Wheaton not only did an outstanding job during her first season, but was also successful with the exterior and interior structural upgrades at the pool. He also mentioned that this year's corn roast throughout the departments were noticeably less stressful than prior years.

Mayor Bacci noted that Mackenzy Vokac will be replacing Barb Cash once she retires next year. Also, Ms. Vokac will be in attendance tonight at the council meeting. Mayor Bacci stated that Parrish Mines is working out wonderfully in our building department. Asst. Building Commissioner LaBella has been taking Mr. Mines to different job sites and showing him around town and is happy to have the help in the department.

Mayor Bacci spoke about the Capital Project consolidation. The village was approved for the Brownfield Grant for Nicky Boulevard in the amount of \$4.2 million, the MCIP Grant for \$3 million for the courts project, and the unknown delivery date of the firefighters' apparatus which may come sometime in 2026. Grant money is not given to the village until the projects are completed in full.

The Klima Gardens project went out for bid and was published accordingly, and only one bidder applied—possibly due to the size and speed/performance period. The bid came in over several hundred thousand dollars of our estimate. The entire scope of the project would include a new roof, both new front and back parking lots, facility upgrades, technology upgrades, utility upgrades and reconfiguring placement of the playground and bocce ball court areas, as well as aesthetics from the street. Estimated cost to be about \$4 million.

Engineer Sciano confirmed that the East 71<sup>st</sup> Street hill would be around \$7 million to fix in three years. He further noted that in 2028 we plan to go before council to get a loan for the amount of

this project. The Mayor and CFO would like to borrow that money in 2026 to assist with cash flow while awaiting grant reimbursements, instead of waiting until 2028 to work with lenders for capital improvement projects. It was further noted that when the grants come in, we will keep and utilize them for all future capital improvements including the hill. Simply put, we would like to borrow early to cover our cash flow. CFO Meriwether stated that our current bond is 30 years with Key Bank, with an annual payment of \$590,000. This would result in total debt services not exceeding \$14-\$15 million. CFO Meriwether noted that she has a meeting scheduled to get further details on all financing options and will present those to council over the next several months.

The mayor asked for a motion to go into executive session for discipline of an employee. Mr. Unger made the motion to go into executive session, seconded by Mr. Contipelli. All in favor, none opposed, motion approved. Executive session started at 5:45 p.m.

Caucus ended at 5:55 p.m.
