Flu Shots - FINAL REMINDER

In cooperation with Discount Drug Mart, Nurse Socauskay, and our office, we are offering flu shots and blood work to our village senior residents (60 years of age and older) on Friday, September 11 in the village hall auditorium.

Blood work appointments will begin at 8:30 a.m. in 10-minute increments; flu shots will begin at 9:00 a.m. in 3-minute increments. As a reminder, if you plan to get blood work, please do not eat or drink anything except water after midnight the night before. Flu shots and blood work will strictly be by appointment only, so please contact Lee Ann at the village hall during normal business hours to schedule your appointment. Drug Mart will provide our office with registration forms which we will drop off at your home prior to the event. You will need to fill out the form and bring it with you on the day of your appointment. We will again be serving a warm breakfast for our senior citizens (packaged in individual containers)—so you can either eat it that morning in the auditorium or take it home with you. If you are 65 years of age or older, please bring your Medicare Card as we will seek Medicare payment for qualifying seniors. Our village will pay for flu shots for our village senior residents and employees just like we have done in the past. **The deadline for registering is Friday, August 28!**

~Partnering with Our Schools

These visits help us stay familiar with the layout of the buildings and prepare us to respond quickly and effectively in the event of an emergency.

~Supporting Safety Drills

Throughout the school year, we assist with fire and emergency drills to ensure students, teachers, and staff know what to do in a real situation. Safety education remains a top priority, and our team will continue visiting classrooms to teach students about fire prevention, emergency preparedness, and when to call 911.

~Watch for Buses and Students

We'd like to remind everyone to drive cautiously as school returns, obey school zone speed limits, stay alert at crosswalks, and never pass a stopped school bus. The safety of our children depends on all of us working together.

Summer has quickly approached us with some hot, dry, humid and hazy days. We are now rounding 3rd base soon to be heading into the FALL season. This month's newsletter is a recap of previous publications just to make sure that these important topics hit home with our residents. Below is a quick breakdown of the following topics that we all should be aware of as we begin to transition into another season and to make project planning & home maintenance go a little bit smoother.



Late-Summer Construction & DIY Reminders

- **Deck Maintenance and Safety:** Highlight the importance of checking wood for rot, loose railings, and ensuring existing permits for additions and renovations are closed out.
- **Roofing and Siding Work:** Remind contractors and homeowners to take advantage of the dry weather to finish exterior renovations, while emphasizing safety.
- **Back-to-School Safety Zones:** Provide reminders about construction traffic control and maintaining safe pedestrian routes around school zones as the academic year begins.



Code Compliance & Property Maintenance

- **Overgrown Grass and Weeds:** Unkept lots or vegetation over a certain height (6") are a code violation.
- **Debris and Junk Removal:** Be aware of the regulations for discarding construction materials and outline local limits on storing untagged vehicles in residential zones.
- **Securing Vacant Properties:** Owners of vacant or under-construction lots and homes should keep properties secured and free of litter.



Permitting, Licensing & Public Safety Observances

- **Licensing Verification:** Residents, please check the credentials of your proposed contractor and only hire licensed, bonded and insured contractors who are registered to provide business for the Village of Cuyahoga Heights for your fall home improvement projects.
- **Permit Turnaround Times:** Permits are good and remain valid for a period up to and not to exceed 180 days. Please be weary of permit and Suhy Grant admissions for timely completion of projects.
- **Fire Prevention:** August is a key time to remind the community about fire hazard awareness, such as clearing dry bush from structures and testing smoke alarms.

Did You Know? In order to apply for funding through the GEORGE M. SUHY GRANT that you need to have a VALID BUILDING PERMIT from the village building department to get credit for your renovations.

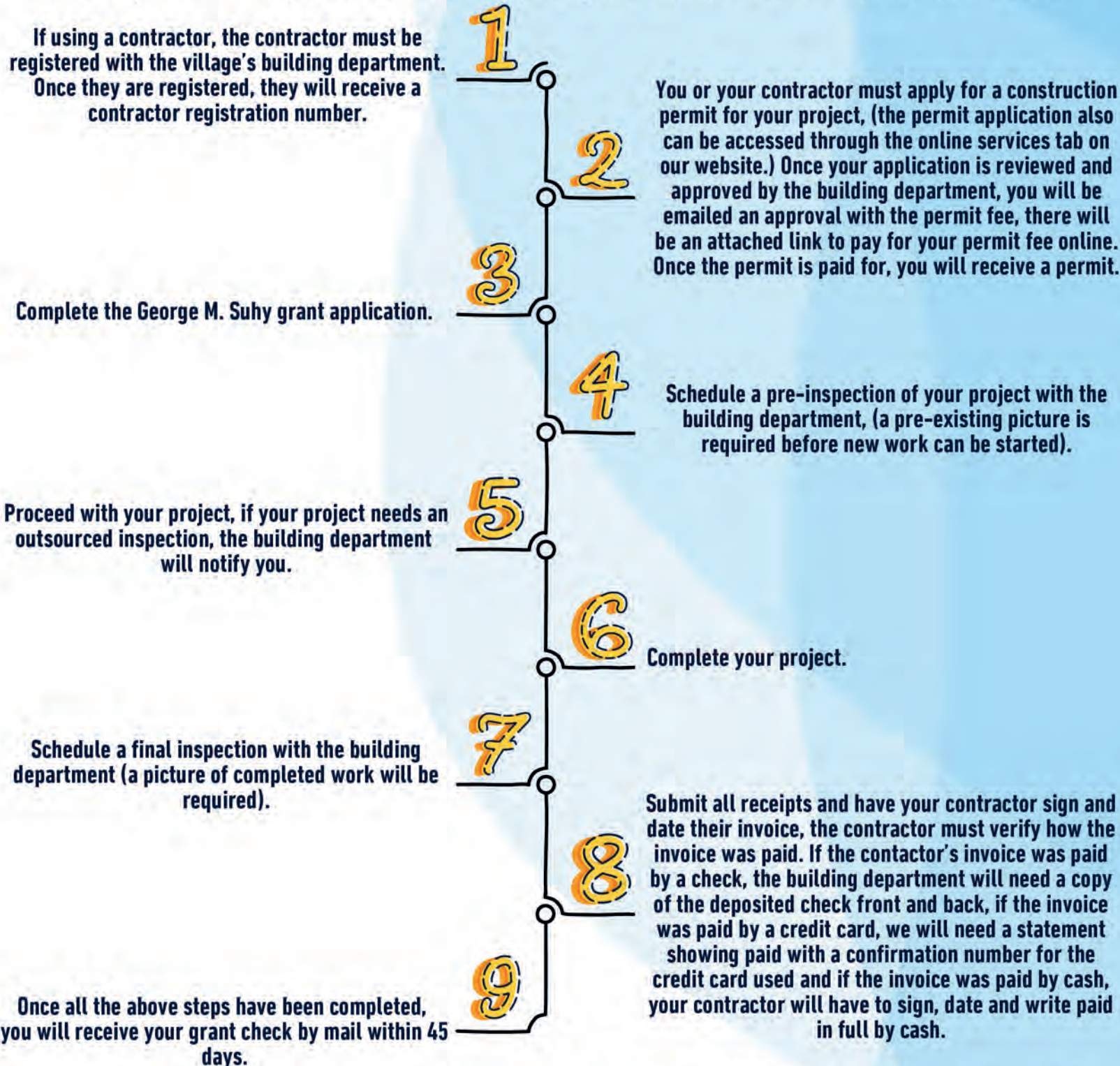
We're Here to Help: The building department is available to assist with permits, inspections, and property maintenance questions.

The process is now done online through our website at www.cuyahogaheights.gov, click on the online services tab at the top of the page and scroll down to Suhy grant application. This is where you will start your application for your grant. Please follow the steps listed below:



Please note: If you do not have access to a computer, please call the building department and we can schedule a time when you can come into the village hall, and we will assist you in filling the application out on a village computer. Please call 216-641-7020 to schedule with the building department Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. and 1:00-4:30 p.m.



Service Department

Our website now features service applications for village residents to apply online!

To apply, go to www.cuyahogaheights.gov, click on the "Online Services" tab then scroll down to "Service Department". Any of our services are available also by calling our service department during normal business hours

from 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m. Monday through Friday.

Services below with  you can request online!

Garbage Pick Up/ Recycling/ Yard Waste

When: Every Monday beginning at 8:00 a.m. *(If holidays land on a Monday, delayed until Tuesday)*

Our service department collects garbage at no charge to its residents. They will come into your yard and take your garbage tote and recycling container to the curb; afterwards they will carry it back into your yard.

Newspaper/ Cardboard Recycling

Location of Recycling Container: Rear parking lot of Bacci Park

Strictly for cardboard and newspaper. Please make sure to break down your cardboard boxes before placing them in the container. Stop on down and do your part in recycling. If you have a large amount and are unable to take it to the container, call or sign up online for a "Special Pick Up".

Special Pick Up

When: Tuesday mornings (Wednesdays, if Mondays are a holiday)

Can include: Oversized items, large quantities or hazardous waste materials.

Sign up by 4:00 p.m. Mondays.

You'll need: Name, address, and all information regarding items you would like to be picked up and where they are located. You will then get an email response when the request has been successfully submitted. If you have any questions, please contact Vera at 216-641-3505.

Charity Pick Up

When: First Wednesday of the month

Donatable items: Small household items & clothing.

Sign up prior to the first Wednesday of the month. No tax receipts are given for this service. If you have any questions, please contact the service department.

Table & Chair Rentals

Cost: No cost

Availability: Limited to 3 tables and 30 chairs

Tables and chairs are offered to our residents to rent for parties held at their residence. Reserve online or by calling the service department.



Service Department

Dumpster Rentals

Cost: \$30 each dumpster load

Rental Duration: Maximum of two (2) weeks

Approved items: Yard waste, construction debris or miscellaneous household items

Restricted Items: Carpet, tires, or hazardous waste. **Please do not mix materials!**

Provide your information and select a preferred delivery date for the dumpster and specify the location for placement. You also can drop off cash or check payments at village hall. *Please note that the disposal of debris created from outside the village is prohibited.*

Pest & Insect Control

Cost: Free for residents ***with the exception of termites, bed bugs, and wildlife*

Once we receive a request, the service department will coordinate with our pest control vendor. Additionally, the village conducts exterior spraying of your home in the spring to help prevent unwanted pests from entering. As always, you can also reach out to the service department to report any issues.

Meals On Wheels

Cost: \$25.00 per week

Age: 60 years and older

Our senior residents can sign up for one meal a day to be delivered to their home provided by Lori's Custom Catering. Payment must be made by the Thursday prior to the week you choose. If you have any questions regarding this service, please contact Vera at the service department.

Tree Trimming/Removal

Cost: Free for residents except for stump grinding or crane services

Limits: Two (2) trims and one (1) removal per year

Applications are available online, or a paper copy is available upon request at village hall. Once a request is received, the service department will coordinate with our tree removal contractor to schedule your service. The contractor will contact you directly to arrange timing.

Senior Grass Cutting

Cost: No cost

Eligibility: 60 years and older

Requirements: A signed consent waiver is required to allow access to your property. Applications are available online or upon request at village hall or the service department. Please remember to keep your yard clear of dog waste to help our crew work safely.

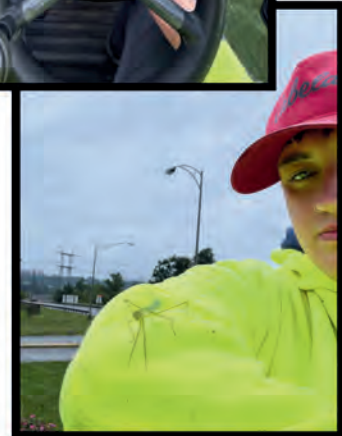
EMPLOYEE SPOTLIGHT

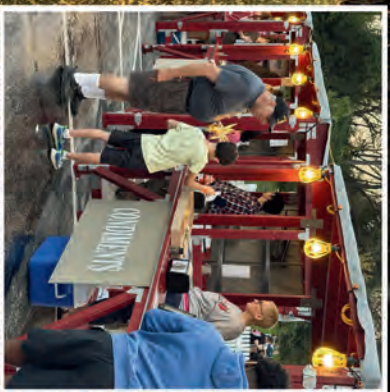
